Application Process

Applications are only accepted through ERAS for the Categorical and Transitional programs. All positions are only offered through the National Residency Matching Program.

- 1244140C0 Categorical Internal Medicine (3 years)
- 1244999P0 Transitional (1 year)

To be considered for Interview, the following materials must be submitted through ERAS no later than December 31:

1. ERAS application
2. Curriculum vitae (ERAS format is acceptable)
3. Personal statement
4. Dean's letter
5. Three letters of recommendation, preferably including one from the chair of the Department of Medicine
6. Medical school transcript
7. USMLE Steps 1 & 2 (Minimum USMLE scores required to be selected for interview is 80 and above, on first attempt, on both USMLE step 1 & 2).
8. Demonstration of current medical education (i.e. graduated from medical school within the past 10 years or 1 year clinical experience such as, transitional or preliminary year)
9. Valid ECFMG certificate, including successful completion of the CSA (if Applicable).
10. Email address

If you are an Osteopathic Medical Student, we require at least USMLE Step 1 scores to be considered for an interview. COMLEX alone does not meet this requirement

Maryland General Hospital adheres to the standards and guidelines for the employment of non-immigrants as established by federal immigration laws and the U.S. Department of Labor. Non-immigrant alien residents will be sponsored under the J-1 visa only. Completion of a minimum of 4 months of active clinical experience in a US or Canadian medical school prior to November is preferred. Clinical observerships are also encouraged. So that we can accurately capture this information, be certain to enter this information in the appropriate areas in ERAS, e.g., under Residency/Fellowship/Work or under Volunteer/Other Work.

Upon review of these materials, you will receive an email informing you if an interview has been granted. Interviews are conducted on Tuesdays and Thursdays from early November through Mid-January. Reduced rates at nearby hotels are available. If you have any questions contact us at 410-225-8790.
